
HIPS AND HARMONIES

Originally from Cornwall, **Hips and Harmonies** is the mother-daughter duo of **Carla Ault Vanderhelm** and **Jess Sauve**. They perform any song that tickles their fancy – especially if they can include sweet harmonies! Their repertoire runs primarily to country and folk, but you never know what they will try to cover. Both play guitar and ukulele, with the addition of mandolin for Carla. They perform regularly at Brockville's Saturday Night Live evenings. This is their first appearance at the Tilted Steeple Coffee House.

KEN JULIEN

Born in Ottawa, **Ken Julien** comes from a family of six children, two of whom are priests at a monastery in St. Jovite, Quebec. A kind and gentle soul with a deep love for music, Ken has been a singer-songwriter for 35 years and is currently working on a CD of original material. A father of five, Ken currently makes his home in Kemptville. A former member of the band Str8fix, he is currently part of the K.Towne Trio, which performed at TSCH last season. He can be heard regularly at the South Branch Bistro, Gad's hill, Harry Mclean's Pub, and Lafayette in Ottawa, in addition to various churches around the area. He has played at Canada Day in Oxford Mills, Canalfest in Merrickville, and Dairyfest in Winchester.

PLAIN FOLK is the group made up of Isabelle Delage, the organizer and host of the Tilted Steeple Coffee House, joined by her bandmates from Montreal, Mick Perreaux and Val Teodori. Together they perform some of Isabelle's original material along with other songs, mostly from the Canadian folk repertoire. Originally from Montreal but now making her home in Morrisburg, Isabelle is a singer-songwriter who draws her inspiration from daily life, writing songs that tell a story about life, love, loss and hope. She has recorded three CDs, two with Plain Folk and a solo CD whose title track, *The Inundation*, is based on the story of the Lost Villages. She is currently working on her second solo CD.
